Robbie Callaway is Director of Government Relations for Boys Clubs of America, an organization chartered by the U.S. Congress in 1860. There are over 1200 Boys and Girls Clubs throughout the United States, Puerto Rico and the Virgin Islands, serving 1.3 million of our nation's youth. The Boys Club's Outreach '91 plan calls for the organization to be serving two million children by the end of 1991. Mr. Callaway, a graduate of the University of Maryland, also serves as Vice President of the Board of Directors of the National Center for Missing and Exploited Children. On the state level, Mr. Callaway has served on the Maryland Governor's Juvenile Justice Advisory Council and locally, as Chairman of the Montgomery County Community Development Committee.

Dr. Gail Christopher, an advisor to the Immigrants All...Americans All program for the development and implementation of the training, is Executive Director of the Family Resource Coalition, a national organization representing over 2,000 family support centers across the nation. Her background includes activities in both the public and private sector, locally and nationally. Dr. Christopher has provided consulting services on program development and training to a host of public and private institutions including Chicago's public and archdiocesan school systems. She is the founder of F.A.M.I.L.I.E.S., Inc., an Illinois not-for-profit organization which provides motivational training and support services for families at risk due to poverty and environmental stress. She has hosted her own weekly radio program, is frequently a guest on local radio and television talk shows and was featured in a national public television documentary, "Crisis on Federal Street."

Dr. Charles B. Keely, Herzberg Chair in International Migration, Georgetown University, is the author and editor of four books and over 40 articles and book chapters on international migration and ethnic relations. Dr. Keely has been Senior Associate at the Population Council, where he was a member of the Center for Policy Studies since 1977. His major research at the Population Council focused on labor migration in the Middle East, international refugee policy and U.S. immigration law. He has been a consultant for a number of federal agencies and private foundations on international migration policy and research and by invitation has testified on immigration matters to Congress with some regularity. He is a member of the National Academy of Sciences Committee on Population, the Population Association of America, the American Sociological Society and, in 1975, was elected a member of the International Union for the Scientific Study of Population.

Allan Kullen, Director of the Immigrants All...Americans All program, is President of a large Washington-based commercial printing facility. He received his degree in Printing Management from Carnegie Institute of Technology and as a graduate student has taught at the University of California, Berkeley, and later in the Adult Education Program at The Catholic University of America. He was Executive Editor of the New American Encyclopedia and Production Manager for the International Library of Negro (later changed to Afro-American) Life and History and the reprinted version of the Journal of Negro History. Mr. Kullen was the editorial coordinator and production supervisor of a 700+ page Graphic Arts Guide. A charter member of The Coordinating Committee for Ellis Island, Inc., he serves on many local boards in the Washington area.
